THE PENNSBURG STORY In the beginning of 2019, Lighthouse Christian Fellowship in



Pennsburg was looking for a church to help them close their doors, but to also to reopen them as another ministry. Morning Star Fellowship currently had quite a few families who drove past Lighthouse on their way to our Quakertown campus which is only 8 miles away.

The Executive Leadership Team met with the remaining leaders of Lighthouse Christian Fellowship and then gathered together for six weeks to pray and seek the Lord for His will. In a unanimous decision, it was decided that we would go forward. This meant the acquisition of the building and property along with their cash assets of \$260,000 and the dept of \$423,500. There was a lot of work to do ahead.

We cast the vision to the body of Morning Star Fellowship and then designated our Easter Offering in 2019 to the project lovingly called BUILD FOR LIFE 2.0.











A total makeover was envisioned with the hope that some of the work would be accomplished through volunteers on Saturdays and Tuesdays. We had times of prayer in the building to welcome God's plans and to seek His face. We thought we

could accomplish this task by Christmas of 2019 but soon realized that there was just so much to do! We hired outside contractors including Labor Boys, Stray Lights and Sound, Denlee Electric, Michael Reinhart Flooring, and Alderfer Glass. We brought in Mapes Dumpsters and took out load after load. Many skilled volunteers built walls and check-in counters, helped with networking, lighting, and more. It was truly a wonderfully huge undertaking.

By scheduling smaller groups in the building we could spread out to do the work. So many wonderful people helped. There was even a scouting group that pitched in to build the Elementary classroom's stage.

2020 Easter Offering

Every year Morning Star Fellowship has felt God's leading to give our entire Easter offering away. Though Easter 2020 was different, since we were still holding 'online-only' services, we decide that we were going to split the offering between two ministries; Convoy of Hope and Gil and Dolfi Manuda, missionaries to the Datooga tribe in Tanzania Africa.

With the \$15,000 that was given to Gil and Dolfi, they were able to complete the school that our missions team had worked on back in the fall of 2018 located in Gijeedeshdaghat and Esheel, Lake Eyasi Tanzania. 









MORNING STAR FELLOWSHIP 2020 Income and Expense ALL Funds
